Recommendation:	Conduct forums with students and faculty which should include: encouraging students to voice their concerns and fears; discussion of nursing as a profession that is not risk free; examination of how faculty teach skills and procedures that keep patients and caregivers safe through rigorous standards and adherence to universal precautions.	Before schools of nursing can make decisions about how to respond to threats such as Ebola, due diligence to secure the most accurate and evidence-based information is imperative. The faculty and administration of each school are best positioned to understand threats to student and faculty safety in local clinical environments.	Incorporate Ebola-type disaster preparedness training into the curricula by adding extraordinary isolation and safety precautions to standard infection control measures. Infections, such as MRSA, are well known to nurses. Nurses have the knowledge and skills to maintain safe environments for patients and each other in the context of highly infectious diseases.	Incorporate inter- and intra-professional communication into our actions. Maintaining collaborative relationships with colleagues across health care is key to the understanding of Ebola transmission and safety precautions for both the hospital-based team and to the public.	Stay current on evidence-based information and research into prevention and treatment such as the ZMapp, an experimental drug for the treatment of Ebola.	Acknowledge the courageous work of nurses and others providing health care in West Africa. Be mindful of their experiences and lessons learned that can be applied around the world.
