EXAMINATIONS FOR RN PROGRAMS

RN

PRE-ADMISSION

The NLN Pre-Admission Exam for RN programs provides a common basis for nurse educators to evaluate the academic ability of prospective RN students.

PRE-ADMISSION EXAMINATION — RN

PURPOSE: Assists in admission decisions by providing a reliable, common basis for evaluating students' academic ability. Tests basic verbal, math, and science skills at a high school level. The verbal section assesses word knowledge, reading comprehension, and critical thinking; the math section assesses ability to solve mathematical problems involving integers, conversions, fractions, decimals, algebra, and geometry; and the science section assesses knowledge in areas of general biology, human anatomy and physiology, chemistry, and physics.

FORMAT: 214-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Fifty-four of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring. Six forms of the test help to ensure secure administration in a classroom setting.

ADMINISTRATION: This test contains three sections: verbal ability, mathematics, and science. Schedule prior to admission to schools of nursing.

SCORING: Test report includes scores and percentile rank for the composite score and the subscores in verbal, math, and science.

VERBAL: 60 items

MATH: 40 items

SCIENCE: 60 items

RN ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

NLN Achievement Tests for RN programs are nationally standardized tests designed to measure students' achievement in various content areas of the nursing curriculum. They enable faculty to evaluate specific course or program objectives and to compare the scores of students in their program with those of nursing students across the country.

BASIC NURSING CARE I

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of the fundamentals of nursing care, with an emphasis on the nursing process, nursing diagnosis, and the nursing care plan. Includes questions on health promotion and prevention, psychosocial health, and professional accountability. Also addresses basic client needs for nutrition, safety, comfort, activity, and rest.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in nursing fundamentals as described in the test purpose above. *Basic Nursing Care I* may be given by itself or in conjunction with *Basic Nursing Care II*.

SCORING: A total score and two sub-scores listed below are provided with normative data.

CARE MANAGEMENT: 76 items
RELATIONSHIP SKILLS: 24 items

BASIC NURSING CARE II

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of the fundamentals of nursing care, with an emphasis on setting priorities and critical thinking. Care of physiological needs (including oxygenation and the maintenance of fluid and electrolyte balance) and special needs (including preparation for surgery and diagnostic testing) are included. Also addresses the principles of medication administration.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in nursing fundamentals as described in the test purpose above. *Basic Nursing Care II* may be given by itself or in conjunction with *Basic Nursing Care I*.

SCORING: A total score and two subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

NURSING CARE OF CHILDREN

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of concepts related to the delivery of culturally competent nursing care for children and their families in a variety of health care settings. Includes relevant items on nutrition, pharmacology, and interpersonal relationships during growth and development.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in child health nursing.

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of nursing care measures, with an emphasis on normal and abnormal physiological and psychosocial changes occurring during pregnancy and in childhood. Topics addressed include normal growth and development, deviations from expected developmental norms, and implications for nursing assessment, intervention, and teaching during the childbearing and child-rearing years. Incorporates relevant items on communication, nutrition, and pharmacology.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in maternity and child health nursing.

SCORING: A total score and two subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of concepts basic to culturally competent nursing care of the childbearing family. Incorporates relevant items on communication, nutrition, and pharmacology.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in maternal child nursing.

SCORING: A total score and three subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

NURSING CARE OF ADULTS I

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of concepts basic to the care of adult clients and their families, including prevention and health promotion, early detection, care management, health maintenance and restoration, and psychosocial aspects of health care. Emphasis is on the nurse's role in providing care to adults experiencing alterations in fluid and gas transport; metabolic, gastrointestinal, musculoskeletal and renal function; fluid and electrolyte imbalances; and pre- and post-operative care.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in adult health nursing, which includes health alterations as described in the test purpose above.

SCORING: A total score and three subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

ACUTE CARE: 51 items

NURSING CARE OF ADULTS II

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of the application of the nursing process to the specific needs of the adult client for prevention and health promotion, early detection, care management, health maintenance and restoration, and psychosocial aspects of health care. Targets the nurse's role in providing care to adults experiencing acute trauma; and cardiovascular, immune, neuro/sensory and respiratory alterations.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in adult health nursing, which includes health alterations as described in the test purpose above.

SCORING: A total score and three subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

ACUTE CARE: 49 items
CHRONIC CARE: 30 items
HEALTH PROMOTION: 21 items

HEALTH AND ILLNESS: ADULT CARE

PURPOSE: Measures ability to utilize critical thinking skills and the nursing process in addressing the health care needs of adult clients and their families across the health-illness continuum. Includes items on health promotion and care strategies, resource management, leadership skills, and research applications. Also addresses application of community focus skills such as education approaches, outcome evaluation, and collaborative strategies in a variety of community settings.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule at the completion of all course work in adult health nursing.

PSYCHIATRIC MENTAL HEALTH NURSING

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of concepts related to mental health nursing. Principles of therapeutic communication and psychopharmacology are included. All questions are framed in the context of the nursing process.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in a basic psychiatric course.

SCORING: A total score and two subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

COMPREHENSIVE PSYCHIATRIC NURSING

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of key mental health concepts and application of critical thinking skills in the care of clients with mental health disorders. Uses simulated nurse-client interactions to address theoretical frameworks of practice, behavioral adaptation, therapeutic modalities, and application of mental health and mental illness concepts. Incorporates relevant items on pharmacology.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule at the completion of all course work in psychiatric-mental health nursing.

SCORING: A total score and three subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

PHARMACOLOGY IN CLINICAL NURSING

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of pharmacological properties of medications, and ability to practice safely in medication administration. Specific topics include dosage calculation, principles of medication administration, pharmacological actions, and therapeutic and adverse effects of medications. Includes questions on the medications commonly prescribed in adult, children's, women's, and mental health practice areas.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule at the completion of the educational program, after students have administered medication to clients in various clinical settings.

SCORING: A total score and three subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

CALCULATIONS: 28 items

PRINCIPLES: 34 items

EFFECTS: 38 items

PHYSICAL ASSESSMENT

PURPOSE: Evaluates understanding of the general health assessment and physical examination techniques used to evaluate the health status of adults and children. Reflects nurse-client encounters in a variety of health care settings, using a body systems approach for evaluating physical data-gathering techniques. Includes items on interviewing, obtaining a health history, general screening, and documentation. Health status and developmental stages of clients are also considered.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of all learning experiences in health and physical assessment.

SCORING: A total score and two sub-scores listed below are provided with normative data.

COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of contemporary community health nursing practice. Emphasis is on the care of individuals, families, and groups in the context of promoting and preserving the health of the community. Reflects content essential for preparing nurses for entry-level community health nursing practice as recommended by the Association of Community Health Nursing Educators (ACHNE).

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in community health nursing.

SCORING: A total score and two sub-scores listed below are provided with normative data.

ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGY

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of the normal structure and physiology of the human body. Items focus on cellular metabolism and membrane physiology; major body systems (circulatory, respiratory, musculoskeletal, gastrointestinal, endocrine, urinary, immune, integumentary) and the heart; metabolism and temperature control; reproduction; and special areas.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in anatomy and physiology.

SCORING: A total score and two sub-scores listed below are provided with normative data.

ANATOMY: 38 items
PHYSIOLOGY: 62 items

NORMAL NUTRITION

PURPOSE: This test assesses students' knowledge of normal nutrition and its application throughout the life cycle. Items focus on nutrients in food and their role throughout the life cycle; digestion, absorption, and metabolism of food; social, economic, and legal factors affecting nutrition and food safety; and nutritional assessment.

FORMAT: 100-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Can be administered in two hours. Schedule after completion of course work in normal nutrition. Students do not need clinical nursing experience to answer the questions.

SCORING: A total score and two subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

MICROBIOLOGY

PURPOSE: Assesses understanding of the basic processes, structure, and function of microorganisms causing communicable diseases, the body's immunological response to foreign substances, and the epidemiology of communicable diseases. Items address the basic cellular, structural and functional differences of microorganisms; the body's immunological responses to microorganisms; how communicable diseases are transmitted by microorganisms; and methods of disease control.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule after completion of course work in microbiology.

SCORING: A total score and three subscores listed below are provided with normative data.

MICROORGANISMS: 27 items

IMMUNOLOGY: 43 items

EPIDEMIOLOGY: 30 items

BACCALAUREATE ACHIEVEMENT

PURPOSE: Measures ability to utilize critical thinking skills and the nursing process in addressing health care needs of clients, families, communities, and aggregates. Includes community focus, health promotion and care strategies, resource management, leadership skills, research applications, and collaborative, educational strategies. This test is comprehensive in scope, incorporating items from the adult, women's, mental, and community health practice areas.

FORMAT: 125-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Twenty-five of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule at the completion of the nursing program.

DIAGNOSTIC READINESS TEST FOR RN LICENSURE

PURPOSE: This predictive examination evaluates the abilities and skills required for entry-level nursing practice as measured by the NCLEX-RN®.

FORMAT: 172-item, four-option, multiple-choice.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule at the completion of the nursing program. The Diagnostic Readiness Test is not secure and may be ordered by educators and nurse candidates.

Test booklets do not need to be returned and can be used for further study and remediation.

SCORING: A statement about the likelihood of success on the NCLEX-RN® is included based on the total score earned by the examinee. Performance reports provide diagnostic information in the areas of health alterations, the nursing process, client needs (NCLEX-RN® test plan), and clinical practice. The detailed, customized report for the examinee uses a graph to indicate strengths and weaknesses on 26 subscales. This report can be used as an individualized study plan. Correct answer rationales for all items and a reference list are provided. Online users receive immediate feedback of test results.

Online Test Supplement to Selected Pre-NCLEX® Readiness Exams

ALTERNATE-ITEM RN PRACTICE EXAMINATION (ONLINE ONLY)

PURPOSE: Self-study test allows students who are graduating from registered nursing programs to practice answering alternate-type questions similar to those that are being added to the NCLEX-RN® test pool. PURPOSE: This predictive examination evaluates the range of knowledge required for the beginning registered nurse. Written in the nursing process framework, this test can be used to assess students' readiness for the NCLEX-RN®.

FORMAT: 141-item, four-option, multiple-choice.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule at the completion of the educational program.

SCORING: A statement about the likelihood of success on the NCLEX-RN® is included based on the total score earned by the examinee. The performance report is based on the NCLEX-RN® test plan. Diagnostic profiles are provided.

**CRITICAL THINKING IN CLINICAL
NURSING PRACTICE — RN**

PURPOSE: Assesses critical thinking skills in the context of nursing practice. This test evaluates students on 19 critical thinking behaviors that measure these five critical thinking skills: interpretation, analysis, evaluation, inference, and explanation. Items are written in the framework of the nursing process and address nine nursing content areas, including research, legal/ethical, leadership, health promotion/risk management, and therapeutic communication.

FORMAT: 120-item, four-option, multiple-choice.

ADMINISTRATION: Schedule at the completion of the educational program.

SCORING: A total score and four subscores in the areas of critical thinking skills; nursing content; nursing process; and safe, effective care environment are provided with normative data.

PRE-ADMISSION

The NLN Pre-Admission Exam for PN programs provides a common basis for nurse educators to evaluate the academic ability of prospective PN students.

Online Registration:

PRE-ADMISSION EXAMINATION — PN

PURPOSE: Assists in admission decisions by providing a reliable, common basis for evaluating students' academic ability. Tests basic verbal, math, and science skills at a high school level. The verbal section assesses word knowledge, reading comprehension, and critical thinking; the math section assesses ability to solve mathematical problems involving integers, conversions, fractions, decimals, algebra, and geometry; and the science section assesses knowledge in areas of general biology, human anatomy and physiology, chemistry, and physics.

FORMAT: 214-item, four-option, multiple-choice. Fifty-four of these items are for experimental purposes and not included in the scoring. Six forms of the test help to ensure secure administration in a classroom setting.

ADMINISTRATION: This test contains three sections: verbal ability, mathematics, and science. Schedule prior to admission to schools of nursing.

SCORING: Test report includes scores and percentile rank for the composite score and the subscores in verbal, math, and science.

PN ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

Test booklets do not need to be returned and can be used for further study and remediation.

SCORING: A statement about the likelihood of success on the NCLEX-PN® is included based on the total score earned by the examinee. Performance reports provide diagnostic information in the areas of health alterations, the nursing process, client needs (NCLEX-PN® test plan), and clinical practice.
