Practice Analysis

Each certification has a practice analysis as a basis which leads to:

Each has its own eligibility criteria

Each has competencies and task statements

Each has its own focus: CNE: full scope of the role; CNEcl focus on the clinical nurse educator; CNEn leveled CNE competencies of the novice nurse educator



International Scope

All exams/certifications are available to international nurse educator testers who meet criteria

Remain in English

Concepts have broadened rather than focusing on the U.S.-centric institutions



CNE Eligibility Option A

Licensure/certificate

Education

Master's or doctoral degree in nursing

Major emphasis in nursing education

or

Post master's certificate in nursing education

or

Nine or more hours of graduate level education courses



CNE Eligibility Option B

Licensure/certificate

Education

A master's degree in nursing or doctoral degree in nursing

Experience

Two or more years of employment in an academic nursing program within the last five years



CNEcl Eligibility Option A

Licensure/certificate

Education

A graduate degree with a focus in nursing education (or higher)

Professional Practice

Three years in any area of nursing

Academic Practice

Two years of teaching experience in an academic program in five years



CNEcl Eligibility Option B

License/certificate

Education

A baccalaureate degree in nursing (or higher)

Professional Practice

Three years in any area of nursing

CNEn Eligibility

License/certificate

Education

Graduate degree in nursing with a nursing education focus

Graduate degree in nursing with nine or more credit hours of graduate level education courses OR a post baccalaureate certificate in nursing education

Practice

Currently within the first three years of educator practice

Application/Registration

The same process for all examinations

Certification Portal on each exam web page to access

Complete application online

Do not submit any substantiating documentation unless it is later requested



Next Steps

Once approved, an email will be sent from Meazure Learning (check Junk box if not received in 3-5 working days)

The email contains instructions for scheduling of exam, either in testing center or remote live proctored

Schedule is open so no testing time blocks

Eligibility to test is for 90 days post approval



Preparatory Actions

Self Assessment Exams

Study by the test blueprint

Online review courses on NLN website: CNE, CNEcl



For the Unsuccessful Candidate

May not retest until 90-day period has passed: the software system will not allow a new registration

Use the diagnostic report of the outcomes of testing to plan study for retesting



Parameters of Certifications

CNE: five-year cycle; expires 12/31 of the fifth year BUT renewal materials are due by 10/1 of the expiration year

CNEcl: five-year cycle; expires 12/31 of the fifth year BUT renewal materials are due by 10/1 of the fifth year

CNEn: three-year certification; not renewable



E-Portfolio

Once successful, profile contains a link to Renewal

Renewal CE information and activities should be described with a reflection and upload of substantiation may be done at any time

Highly suggested to upload as are done and not wait until the last minute



Certification Star Awards

Annual award given at the NLN Summit Individual and Program

Given to program or an individual who has demonstrated great commitment to certification

Applications are available on the Certification website and are due by June 1st

Examples: 100% of faculty certified; integrated quality improvement plan includes certification; dedication to assisting faculty to achieve certification
