My name is Eileen and I'm Angela Foster's best friend. We've known each other for over 30 years, since our kids were in grade school together, and now we're both grandmas. Angela is an only child, so we were like sisters. Our families were close as our kids were growing up and we did a lot of things together. But then we both had lots of change in our lives, and we really needed each other over the past 12 years or so. She is now trying to finish her business degree and she's having a hard time. She gets no child support from him, which is OK with her because she wants NO contact with him. And now she has financial issues, so I am helping out by taking care of her daughter Harper. I love that little girl, I retired early just so I could help with her. I also worry about Jen because she always had problems with depression. I want so badly for Jennifer to succeed in school and be able to take care of herself and Harper and have some happiness in her life.
