

Student Interview Guide for the Family or Informal Caregiver of an Older Adult

Interview a family member or informal (non-paid) caregiver.

- 1. Introduce yourself and state the purpose of the interview.
- 2. Inform the caregiver being interviewed that this interview is for a class project and that information from the interview will be shared only with the teacher and classmates.
- 3. Inform the caregiver that his/her name will be kept confidential.
- 4. Before starting the interview, ask if these terms to protect privacy are acceptable. Ensure that the caregiver is willing to continue.
- 5. If the terms are not agreed upon, say thank you for your time and consider finding someone else to interview.

Sample Interview Introductory Statement:

Once there is an agreement to continue the interview, discuss why this interview is important to your learning.

Example statement:

"Thank you for taking time to talk with me today. Sharing your experience as a caregiver will help advance my learning as a nurse to better understand the perspective of a family caregiver. There are no right or wrong answers to my questions. I just want to hear about your perspective."

- 1. What does it mean to you to be a caregiver for your family member?
- 2. What are the best parts of being a caregiver?
- 3. Tell me about any experiences you have had with health care professionals that contributed to how you think of your role as a family caregiver?
- 4. What advice would you give to nurses regarding how to support family caregivers?
